It's a learning process for all of us...As promised we are here for you!

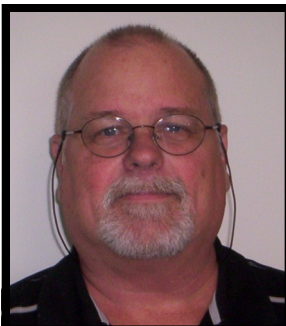

Dana's Desktop

Hello and welcome to the first contributor column from your friendly IT department. My name is Dana Andrews (IT Technician) and I will be writing about various items, announcements, interesting information, updates, tips, fixes, tweaks, and myths involving the digital technology field, especially as it applies here in Grant County.

In this inaugural article, I would like to make two brief observations:

1 The first is for those who think their computer is slow. In a recent topic from Extreme Tech (www.extremetech.com) about the history of supercomputers, they noted that "... (the fastest super-computer) released in 1996, had 2048 processors and a peak performance of 600 gigaflops — by comparison, a modern ... i5 or i7 CPU can perform around 100-200 gigaflops." Think about it, the computer in front of you is faster and may have more storage than the computers that were used to model nuclear explosions during the cold war! We sometimes forget that the modern PC is still in its infancy, only being approximately 41 years old. Relating that to the development of the modern automobile, we are talking about the late 1920's models! How many fields of interest do you know where most of the founding fathers are still alive? So, is your computer slow or just not meeting your expectations?

2 The second, and final, observation is the explosive growth in 'social engineered marketing'. For good or bad, those who want to do business with you (legitimate and criminal) via a digital device, have come to the understanding that to be effective, they have to know you! General ads and broad appeals (hi, I am the son of a king and need you to put my billion dollars in your bank account ...) are not as effective as something that relates personally to you. While last year it was emails where it was hard to tell them from the real thing, this year's crop are items that appeal to what is believed to be your interests. Have you noticed how many of the ads on the websites are now for local businesses or relate to things you recently bought online? Same with the email scams such as notice of a speeding ticket or UPS delivery where even the return address looks legit. The average user can no longer afford to be innocent when using electronic communication these days, be it computer, laptop, netbook, tablet, or phone. Two actions that can help are to never be afraid to ask questions and break the habit of thinking you have to reply right away! To quote Dickens, "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us, we had nothing before us."
