THREE YEAR MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENT

For GRANT COUNTY PRIVATE ONSITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEMS (POWTS)

The Grant County POWTS Ordinance requires proper maintenance performed every three years after the installation of your system. You will receive notice that it must be inspected or pumped by a Wisconsin licensed master plumber, master restricted sewer plumber, septic tank pumper, registered POWTS maintainer, or a POWTS inspector.

A licensed person must complete and sign the form certifying that:

- The POWTS is in proper operating condition.
- The septic tank was pumped by a Wisconsin licensed septic tank pumper or was inspected and is less than one-third full of sludge and scum.

The homeowner is responsible for returning the form to Grant County Conservation, Sanitation, and Zoning Department office with the required maintenance fee included.

A septic system is relied on to treat and dispose of household wastewater. Proper operation and maintenance can have a significant impact on how well it works and how long it lasts.

Proper Maintenance Practices:

- Conserve water
- Plant grass only over the drain field
- Sparingly use household cleaners and bleach as they can be hard on a system
- Inspect and clean the effluent filter as needed

System Abuse:

- Flushing hazardous wastes, chemicals, food scraps, cat litter, feminine products, disposable diapers, paint/varnish, etc.
- Driving or operating heavy machinery over any part of the system
- Building overtop the drain field
