Vaccines for Children Program



Worried about the cost of vaccines for your children? You may qualify to receive vaccines through the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program.

About the VFC program:

- Provides vaccines to eligible children, at no charge, through VFC enrolled public doctor offices.
- Covers vaccines recommended by medical experts, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- Eliminates or reduces cost as a barrier to vaccinating eligible children.
- Saves parents out-of-pocket expenses for vaccine.
- Saves time by getting vaccines at a regular doctor visit.

Children through age 18 are eligible if:

- They are Medicaid eligible or Medicaid-enrolled.
- They have no health insurance.
- They are American Indian or Alaska Native, as defined by the Indian Health Care Improvement Act (25 U.S.C. 1603).
- They have health insurance, but the coverage does not include vaccines, or only covers selected vaccines. In this case, children are only eligible to receive vaccines through a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) or Rural Health Clinic (RHC).
