

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- 1. Make the initial evaluation visit to patient.
- 2. Evaluation of patient's status is required before initiation of patient care. Evaluation and treatment plan is submitted to the family physician for his approval and signature at the first visit. One copy is returned to therapist and the original placed in the patient record. Physician=s recertification of the plan is required every 60 days.
- 3. Initiate the plan of treatment and make necessary revisions.

Treatment plan should include:

- a. Speech Therapy problem
- b. Intervention plan
- c. Expected outcome
- 4. Progress notes are made of each treatment given and are done in accordance with problem oriented recording. Progress notes shall note any change in patient=s condition and any change of treatment plan. They shall include subjective and objective information, action and assessment of progress and plan.
- 5. Goals short and long term must be recorded on evaluation sheet. Goals should be realistic expectations of what patient can achieve from speech therapy program.
- 6. It is the therapist's responsibility to inform the referring practitioner and Health Department supervisor when patient has reached maximum benefit from treatment and seek discontinuation of patient's speech therapy program.

- 7. Final assessment should include status on discharge and extent and attainment of the goals.
- 8. Participates in staff conferences when necessary.

Special notes for Hospice patients

- 1. The goal of care will be palliation.
- 2. Development and changes in the plan of care will be done in consultation with the Hospice Core Team.
- 3. Discharge of the patient will be done in consultation with the Hospice Core Team.
