#### June 21, 2011

The Grant County Board of Supervisors met on Tuesday, June 21, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. in the Room 264 of the Administration Building, Second Floor in Lancaster, WI pursuant to the adjournment of the May 17, 2011 meeting.

Chair John Patcle called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Stephen Adrian, seconded by Ivan Farness, made a motion to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

John Beinborn, seconded by Lester Jantzen made a motion to approve the minutes of the May 17, 2011. Motion carried.

Sherlyn Kleinow for 35 years of service at Social Services. <u>Communications</u>: John Patcle, Chair informed the Board Members about the Christening of the Cassville Car Ferry; that will take place on Saturday, July 16, 2011 at 3:00 p.m. at the Ferry Landing in Cassville, WI.

John Patcle, Chair, extended a Thank you to the citizens who helped in the rebuilding of the O'Leary boat dock that had been high water damaged it. The men that called John were Marty Droessler and Craig Timmerman and offered to fix the dock for the cost of the materials.

## Appointments: None

<u>Revolving Loan</u>: Ron Brisbois, Economic Development, presented the Revolving Loan Application for EMS-US Insulated Doors. EMS-US is an insulated door company that is currently assembling components from Germany. They plan to expand and start manufacturing and assembly of insulted doors in Cuba City.

The doors are stainless steel insulated doors used in the food storage and production as well as the pharmaceutical industries. Companies such as Nu-Pak, Shullsburg Cheese and Hormel have installed their doors, along with several cheese producers in Green County.

EMS plans to move all manufacturing and stamping operations from Germany to this location.

They are requesting \$100,000 at a 3% rate, term of 10 years to purchase a building in Cuba City. They plan to create 30 new jobs. They are currently located in Dubuque, IA.

Vincent Loeffelholz, seconded by Grant Loy, made a motion to approve the Revolving Loan application for EMS. Motion carried.

# Grants: None.

<u>Request to create a maintenance department and transfer budget</u>: Recommended for approval by the Executive committee on June 15, 2011. Initially the budget will include payroll for the Facilities Maintenance Supervisor and the Maintenance Workers from Ag and Extension, Law Enforcement, Courthouse and Administration Building. Existing maintenance expenditures for parts, etc., will continue to be done through the departments for the remainder of this year. Effective January 1, 2012, the maintenance budget will be inclusive of all maintenance expenditures for these departments. Patrick Schroeder, seconded by Stephen Adrian, made a motion to approve establishing a Maintenance Department. Motion carried.

<u>Zoning Amendments</u>: John Patcle, Chair; announced that there would be no action taken on the Zoning Amendments that were supposed to be presented at the meeting. John went on to say that it had been recently pointed out by the Corporation Counsel, Todd Infield; that none of the Zoning Amendments new use is consistence with the Comprehensive Plan and therefore not in compliant with the Grant County Comprehensive Plan. The Amendment requests will have to go back to the Township level for them to make the necessary amendments to the Township Comprehensive Plans. Once approved at that level; the Amendment requests would come to the County and meet with the Planning and Zoning Committee so the County has the option to make necessary amendment changes to the County Comprehensive Plan. Once the Zoning Amendment would be in compliance with both the Comprehensive Plans; they would then be submitted before the full County Board for their approval.

Todd Johnson, who is now employed by Grant County Extension Office as an educator, was on hand to answer the questions that came up after this announcement. Todd used to work for the Economic Development Office and was instrumental in setting up the Comprehensive Plans in all the municipalities. He offered his assistance in answering the question of the general public who had attended for the Rezoning Amendment requests. John Patcle instructed the public to contact their municipality officials to explain what the local Comprehensive Plans state and also contact Terry Loeffelholz, Sanitation/Zoning Director for further assistance on information on the County Comprehensive Plan.

In further discussion, it was stated that all the previous Zoning Amendments that had been passed may have to be reviewed to make sure they were in compliance with the County and Municipal Comprehensive Plans.

Livestock Claims: None.

<u>Committee Reports</u>: Executive, Robert Keeney – Maintenance Department structuring and budget issues.

Unified, Mark Stead – Lost two Therapists, Detention is down to 80 due to the change in the State Statute.

Orchard Manor, Pat Schroeder – heat and ventilation issues are completely installed, new roof is coming in under budget.

Fair and Extension, Stephen Adrian – Stephen thanked all the board members who were in attendance for the open house of the Eckstein Exhibit Hall. Talked about up coming events to promote the Fair.

Law Enforcement, Robert Scallon – one drowning reported, new roof going well, all seems quiet.

Railroad – going forward.

Hidden Valley, Grant Loy – going to one meeting every other month, staying with same printer, hope to get a price reduction for printing next year, having good luck with ads.

River Access, Ivan Farness -- Boat Landing tour set for June 29, 2011 at 9:00 a.m.
