Ivan Farness, seconded by Don Splinter, made a motion to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Mark Stead made a motion, seconded by Vern Lewison, to approve the minutes of October 4, 2011 with the addition of the motion passing the Concealed Weapons Ordinance made by Patrick Schroeder, seconded by Stephen Adrian that had been omitted from the minutes. Motion carried.

Employee Recognition: None

<u>Communications</u>: John Patcle, Chair announced that the Lower Wisconsin State Riverway Board would be holding their conference on December 2, 2011 at the House on the Rocks. Any interested Board members who would like to attend should call the Riverway Board and register. Issues on Wisconsin mining will be highlighted.

John Patcle, Chair also informed the Board that he was asked by Greg Pittz, Park Director, to send a letter on behalf of Grant County and the Board of Supervisors giving the Park approval to name the old office building the "Paul Lawrence Interpretive Center".

<u>Appointments</u>: John Patcle, Chair appointed John Beinborn to serve on the Tax Increment District 2 in the city of Cuba City, WI as the representative for Grant County. Patrick Schroeder, seconded by Stephen Adrian, made a motion to approve this appointment. Motion carried.

John Patcle, Chair appointed Patrick Schroeder to serve on the Tax Increment District 3 & 4 in the City of Lancaster, WI as the representative for Grant County. John Beinborn, seconded by Vince Loeffelholz made a motion to approve this appointment. Motion carried.

<u>Brownfields Sites in Grant County</u>: Timothy Streitz, Associate Planner Southwestern WI Regional Planning Commission, presented the following resolution for the Boards approval.

RESOLUTION #37-10 Committing the Grant County Board As a Member of the Brownfields Assessment Coalition

A RESOLUTION authorizing the submittal of a fiscal year 2012 Environmental Protection Agency Brownfields Assessment Grant application on behalf of Grant County, and in conjunction with co-applicants: the Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission and the counties of Green, Iowa, Lafayette, and Richland.

WHEREAS, the Grant County Board recognizes that the identification, remediation, and redevelopment of land complicated by the presence or potential presence of hazardous substances and/or petroleum (i.e. Brownfields) is an important part of protecting the health, environment, and financial resources of its county and communities; and

WHEREAS, the Brownfields Assessment Grant provides funds to inventory, characterize, assess, and conduct planning and community involvement related to Brownfield sites for a performance period of three years; and

WHEREAS, the Brownfields Assessment Grant provides the option of a coalition to submit one grant proposal, with increased funding opportunities, under the name of one of the coalition participants who will be the grant recipient; and

WHEREAS, the Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission is designated as the "lead" participant and, as the grant recipient, will be responsible for grant administration, as described in the FY12 Guidelines for Brownfields Assessment Grants; and

WHEREAS, the Grant County Economic Development Committee has recommended by majority vote that the County Board commit to membership in the Brownfields Assessment Coalition;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Grant County Board, by majority vote, hereby declares its commitment to membership in the Brownfields Assessment Coalition; and

HEREBY AUTHORIZES the Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission to act on the behalf of Grant County to (1) submit a coalition application to the United States Environmental Protection Agency for financial aid for Brownfield Assessment Grant purposes, (2) sign documents, and (3) take necessary action to undertake, direct, and complete approved grant activities. Motion was made by Carol Beals, seconded by Grant Loy to approve this resolution. Motion carried.

<u>Revolving Loan</u>: Ron Brisbois, Economic Development Director, presented two Revolving Loan applications as follows:

- Jones Auto Parts of Boscobel—NAPA Parts. Ryan Jones will be creating a new business in Boscobel on Highway 61, a NAPA Auto parts store. Loan amount: \$50,000, rate 3% term 7 years creating 5 new full time jobs. The RLF Committee has reviewed the application and the financial materials provided by Ryan Jones from his other parts stores in Richland Center and Prairie du Chien. They approve the \$50,000 loan with a personal guarantee and a General Business Security Agreement. Vern Lewison, seconded by Ivan Farness made a motion to approve the Revolving Loan application for Ryan Jones. Motion carried.
- 2. Gary David (Woodworking) Potosi. Gary David is one of the founding members of the Potosi Brewery Foundation and owns the former Potosi Bottling Building which is where he will be constructing a new woodworking shop. He is moving his woodworking business from Galena to this location in Potosi were he will do custom woodworks and projects for businesses and residences. Loan amount is \$20,000, rate 3%, term 7 years, creating 4-6 new full time jobs. The RLF Committee approved the \$20,000 loan with a personal guarantee and a mortgage lien on property, Gary will use the loan for equipment and inventory. John Beinborn, seconded by Vince Loeffelholz made a motion to approve the Revolving Loan application for Gary David. Motion carried.

<u>Presentation of the Community Leadership Alliance</u>: Todd Johnson, Extension Office gave a presentation on the history of the Alliance. It started in July of 1999 with grant funds from the UW Extension. The CLA Founding partners are UW Extension Grant County, UW Extension Iowa County, UW Extension Lafayette, UW Platteville Continuing Education and the Platteville Area Chamber of Commerce. John Dutcher was hired as the part time coordinator. The first class of 30 participants met in January 2000. Each year CLA trains emerging and existing leaders in Southwest WI communities, businesses, organizations, agencies and institutions. These graduates are making a difference where they live and work in the region.

Grants: None

<u>Grant County Employee Handbook</u>: Joyce Roling, Personnel Director went over the changes that have been made in the new employee handbook. The Transition Team has been instrumental in making the necessary changes due to the passing of Act 10 and its mandates, core policies needed to be implemented. The Executive Committee has recommended the approval of the new handbook. After discussion, Stephen Adrian, seconded by Don Splinter made a motion to approve the changes in the Employee Handbook, with the stipulation that if any discrepancies or errors are found in the future they will be corrected or re-looked at. Motion carried, with no nay votes.

<u>2012 Employee Wages</u>: Patrick Schroeder, seconded by Robert Keeney, made a motion to approve a 2% increase in wages for non-represented employees. The fiscal impact is \$117,800. It was stated in discussion

that the represented employees are still considered union employees until the county receives official notice that you are no longer represented by the unions. The Unions are still mandating negotiation on wages and as long as all the contracts are open, bargaining needs to occur. A roll call vote was called for.

County Construction and Maintenance During the Calendar Year 2012:

RESOLUTION NO. 39-10 COUNTY CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 2012

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Grant County, Wisconsin regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the County for highway work in the year 2012 under the provisions of Section 86.30 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be One Million Three Hundred Ninety-Four Thousand, Five Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars and No/100 (\$1,394,588.00) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Section 86.30 of the Statutes, for the County Trunk Highway System in the County, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending December 31, 2011.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal Aid for construction, right of way, and other cost on any Federal projects located on the County Trunk Highway System of said County, which are not recovered from Federal Funds, and to expend any balance for construction, repairing, and maintaining such County Trunk Highway System and Bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 86.30 of the Statutes, and to reimburse the general fund for any expenditures that may be made therefore pursuant to Section 86.30 of the Statutes. The distribution to such purpose to estimated, but not specifically directed, to be as follows:

SECTION III. WHEREAS, it appears that certain highway improvements in the County are necessary and warranted,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

(1) The Sum of Two Hundred Eight Thousand, Four Hundred Two Dollars and 00/100 (\$208,402.00) for Federal Aid Secondary Projects.

(2) For the Maintenance of the County Trunk Highway System the sum of One Million, Five Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand, Five Hundred Eighteen Dollars and 00/100 (\$1,526,518.00).

(3) For emergency road or bridge repairs or construction, the necessity for which is determined by the County Highway Committee for which other funds are not available, the sum of Two Hundred Seventeen Thousand, Eight Hundred Seventy-Three Dollars and 00/100 (\$217,873.00).

(4) For the purchase of machinery the sum of Five Hundred Thousand, Six Hundred Eighteen Dollars and 00/100 (\$500,618.00).

(5) For the purchase, maintenance and repair of machinery the sum received from Machinery Rental.

(6) For the purchase of County Gravel Pits and Stone Quarries the sum received from Quarry Fees.

(7) For administration, including salaries, per diem, incidental labor office and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his bookkeepers and assistant not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of One Hundred Sixty-One Thousand Eight Hundred Three Dollars and 00/100 (\$161,803.00)

(8) For bituminous surfacing on County Trunk Highways the sum of One Million, Nine Hundred Forty-Seven Thousand, Three Hundred Fifty-Nine Dollars and 00/100 (\$1,947,359.00).

(9) For snow and ice control on County Trunk Highways the sum of Eight Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand, Thirty -Nine Dollars and 00/100 (\$898,039.00).

TOTAL AUTHORIZED IN THIS SECTION: \$5,460,612.00

SECTION IV. WHEREAS, appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the State and available for work in the County under Section 86.30 of the Statutes.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the County to meet such appropriations as follows:

(1) For the various purposes as set forth in Section III here of the sum of Four Million, Sixty-Six Thousand, Twenty-Four Dollars and 00/100 (\$4,066,024.00).

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the County Budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

SECTION V. WHEREAS, the various highway activities for which provisions are made in the resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriations, therefore;

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the County Budget, for which provisions are herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VI. WHEREAS, the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the State for highway purposes in the County under Section 86.30 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after July 1, 2012.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as herein before authorized, from any funds in the County Treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to August 1, 2012, and to reimburse such funds in the County Treasury from the sum received under Section 86.30 of the Statutes.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS, the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of the highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Highway Commissioner shall have the authority to employ, discharge, suspend or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided, however, that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, bookkeepers or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

A. Purpose

This policy governs the carryover of unspent appropriations and revenues in excess of expenditures. Grant County has implemented Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 54, *Fund Balance Reporting and Fund Balance Type Definitions*. GASB No. 54 applies only to governmental funds and, therefore, does not apply to Orchard Manor, Highway, or County farm. Additionally, this policy does not apply to Unified Community Services, which is governed by the agreement between Grant and Iowa Counties. The definitions of the fund balance classifications used in this policy shall be consistent with GASB No. 54.

B. Policy Statement

At the close of each year, unspent appropriations and revenues in excess of expenditures will lapse to the fund balance of the fund the department is in unless a carryover is requested and authorized by the County Board. No carryover will be authorized unless allowed by law.

Flow Assumption

When projects or services are funded from a variety of resources, those resources are assumed to be used in the following order:

- 1. Restricted
- 2. Unrestricted
 - a. Committed
 - b. Assigned
 - c. Unassigned

C. Procedure

- 1. Each department shall submit a written request to the Finance Director by December 1 of each year for both discretionary and non-discretionary carryovers to the following year. The Finance Committee will review these requests at the December meeting and make a recommendation to the County Board.
- 2. Carryover amounts are defined below. The examples listed are not all inclusive:
 - a. Non-discretionary
 - a. Non-spendable because of their form. Examples include:
 - i. Delinquent property taxes
 - ii. Prepaid expenditures
 - b. Restricted because of externally enforceable limitations on use. Examples include:
 - a. Statutory restrictions
 - b. Specific donor limitations
 - c. Signed contracts or agreements
 - d. Specific state or federal agency limitations
 - e. Unspent debt proceeds
 - c. Discretionary, which are classified as committed under GASB Statement No. 54. Examples include:
 - a. Funds supporting a project not yet completed but for which no legal restriction exists.

- b. Funds designated for a specific future project
- c. Department surpluses to be used for future appropriations
- d. Special circumstances that shall be considered by the Executive Committee
- d. Discretionary, which are classified as assigned under GASB Statement No. 54. Examples include:
 - a. Unrestricted and uncommitted fund balances of special revenue funds such as Social Services and Aging, Disability, and Resource Center
- 3. Pursuant to the recommendation of the Executive Committee, the County Board shall, at the December meeting, act on a resolution to authorize any discretionary carryover funds with the specific dollar amounts to be determined at a future date.
- 4. Following the close of the budget year, upon determination of the excess appropriations and revenues, the Executive Committee shall recommend to the County Board a resolution specifying the amounts to be carried over.
- 5. Use of assigned fund balances requires authorization of the Executive Committee and County Board.
