RESOLUTION NO. 06-12

Resolution Supporting Request For Stay of Proceedings in MTI v. Walker

WHEREAS, Grant County is a municipal employer, as that term is defined in Wis. Stat. § 111.70; and

WHEREAS, for the past year, the County has taken significant steps in implementing the changes to the collective bargaining system required under 2011 Wisconsin Acts 10 and 32; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the changes to collective bargaining contemplated in Acts 10 and 32, the legislation contained significant cuts to the amount of state aid revenue accruing to the County; and

WHEREAS, in addition to cuts to state aid, Acts 10 and 32 limited the amount of revenue the County is able to raise by virtue of levy limits; and

WHEREAS, in order to balance the County's budget, the County has modified the County's health insurance plan, required employees to pay the employee share of WRS contributions and otherwise modified the terms and conditions associated with its workforce's employment; and

WHEREAS, all of the measures the County has implemented in relation to creating efficiency and economy would have been impossible to implement had the County been required to bargain the changes with its employees; and

WHEREAS, on Friday, September 14, 2012, the Dane County Circuit Court issued a decision that declared a significant number of the provisions of Acts 10 and 32 relating to collective bargaining unconstitutional; and

WHEREAS, the Court's decision did not restore any of the cuts to state aid to the County nor did the decision provide the County with relief to the strict levy limits; and

WHEREAS, the County is very concerned with its ability to meet its obligations in the event the court determines that all of the measures the County has implemented since the effective dates of Act 10 and 32 must be reversed; and

WHEREAS, reversing the County's course at this juncture and restoring the status quo that existed prior to Act 10 would have a devastating financial impact on the County; and

WHEREAS, without additional state aid, the County will be unable to afford its obligations if required to bargain all of the matters surrounding wages, hours and conditions of employment with its represented employees; and

WHEREAS, if forced to return to the status quo of collective bargaining agreements pre-Acts 10 and 32, the County will be forced to consider mass layoffs simply to meet its financial obligations; and

WHEREAS, the County Board believes it to be in the County's best interests, and the best interests of all local governments throughout the state, for the Dane County Circuit Court to stay implementation of its decision pending appeal; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution signifies the County's support for the State of Wisconsin's effort to secure a stay of implementation of the decision to avoid dire financial consequences for the County and its workforce.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board of Supervisors respectfully requests that the Dane County Circuit Court stay implementation of its decision in *MTI v. Walker* pending appeal.

COUNTY BOARD RESOLUTION #09-12

Approved this 18th Day of September, 2012 by GRANT COUNTY Relating to Supporting Legislation Requiring Online-Only Retailers to Collect and Remit Wisconsin Sales Tax

WHEREAS, under current law many online-only retailers are refusing to collect and remit sales taxes in states where they do not have a physical presence; and

WHEREAS, this creates an unfair price advantage for online-only retailers over traditional brick-and-mortar Wisconsin businesses that provide Wisconsin-based jobs; and

WHEREAS, as the amount of unpaid tax by some people grows, more revenue needs to be collected from everyone else to compensate; and

WHEREAS, uncollected Wisconsin state and local sales tax revenue is estimated between \$100 and \$200 million annually; and

WHEREAS, sales tax revenues are an important component of state and local government budgets; and

WHEREAS, this resolution supports all Wisconsin residents, businesses and units of government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Grant County does hereby support legislation requiring online retailers with subsidiaries or affiliates located in Wisconsin to collect and remit Wisconsin sales and local sales tax.

Motion carried.

<u>Attend meeting by Phone</u>: Upon recommendation from the Administrative Committee the Board discussed the issue of attendance by phone at meetings. After much discussion, Patrick Schroeder, seconded by Lester Jantzen made a motion stating that no member will be allowed to attend a committee meeting or board meeting by phone. A voice vote was taken, motion passed with Dwight Nelson voting nay.

Larry Wolf, Chair stated that if at any time this arrangement is not working for the Departments, the issue can be brought back to the full county board for review.

Committee Reports:

Economic Development, John Beinborn—will be attending the meeting in Cassville on Sept 26th regarding the closing of the Nelson Dewey power plant. The first draft of the proposed manual for the Regional Revolving Loan Fund is ready for the RLF steering committee to review and make comments. A video touting the manufacturing businesses in our region and their job opportunities has been completed and will be released by the end of this month.

Executive Committee, John Beinborn –Shared Revenue will be receiving an additional \$147,446.51 from Dept. of Revenue from Cassville Stonefield Plant that should have been subject to utility tax. Health Insurance rates: Medical Associates 10.30% increase, Dean 9.30% increase.

LWC, Mark Stead – three animal waste applications were approved, LWCD has an opportunity to earn \$12,000 to continue training farmers to write their own Nutrient Management Plans. 2013 Budget was approved. Different office network options are being discussed.

Unified- Will be holding an all day training on Oct 5th.

Fair/Extension, John Patcle—Highway – gave road updates. 2013 Budget passed by committee.

Orchard Manor, Robert Keeney, 2013 Budget passed; forester was contacted to harvest pasture trees. Laundry is moving forward.

Law Enforcement, Robert Scallon—Invites all to Jail tour, Jail space issues, Administrative committee will be talking about long term plans needed for future, New Grant County Sheriff is working out fine,

Parks committee --water is very low, good employees that keep the boat landing

functioning. Wisconsin Railway – Meeting was cancelled.

Hidden Valley, Grant Loy—trying to start a library to highlight tourism in Grant County, special tourist attractions of Grant County, working with Todd Johnson and Kathy Kopp to organize this.

ADRC, Dale Hood, 2013 Budget, Muscoda Meal site has moved to City municipal building is now open and working fine.

Health, Dwight Nelson – 2013 Budget, vacant position is now filled.

Social Services – Carol Beals, Foster parents and foster grand parents needed.

Veteran, Lester Jantzen—no meeting. Planning and Zoning—Zoning amendments.

Public Property/IT, Vince Loeffelholz—Fred Naatz thanks maintenance workers, Maintenance worker attended Greenwood Supply show won \$500.00 toward supplies.
