Contract for Wisconsin Hazardous Materials Response System Services: Steve Braun, Emergency Director and Frank Docimo, Hazardous Material Coordinator presented the contract proposal to the County Board of Supervisors. The Contract is for Wisconsin Hazardous Materials Response System Services for a contract term of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015. The contract would be between State of Wisconsin Department of Military Affairs Division of Emergency Management and the City of Madison, WI, City of LaCrosse, WI, Columbia County, WI, Grant County, WI, Rock County, WI, Vernon County, WI, also collectively referred to as the Southwest Wisconsin Hazardous Materials Taskforce. The purpose is to offer a higher level of emergency response in order to protect life and property against the dangers of hazardous material emergencies.

Todd Infield, Corporation Counsel offered his legal opinion that he felt the agreement legally protects all parties involved and he defers to Steve Braun's opinion whether it will benefit the County.

Steve Braun made a recommendation to the Board to approve this contract because he feels this proposal will enhance Grant County's capability to respond to all hazardous type emergencies. It will increase funding capabilities for possible grant money and it will help coordinate and increase cooperation among the participant in working together.

A motion was made by Carol Beals, seconded by Lester Jantzen, to accept the contract between the State of Wisconsin Department of Military Affairs Division of Emergency Management and the Southwest Wisconsin Hazardous Materials Taskforce participants for the term of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015. Motion carried.

<u>Law Enforcement Request for \$66,500 from the General Fund</u>: With the recommendation of the Executive Committee, Nancy Scott, Finance Director presented the request for Law Enforcement for the Board of Supervisors approval.

<u>Record all Meetings</u>: Larry Wolf, Chair asked the Board Members how they felt about having all committee meetings recorded. Larry stated that some committees do record their meetings at this time but it is not a practice with all of the committees in Grant County. After discussion, a straw vote was taken among the Board Members resulting in 4 against and 10 in favor for recording all committee meetings. Larry Wolf stated that he would review this issue further to see what the impact to the County would be if all meetings were recorded.

<u>Highway Software</u>: Nancy Scott, Finance Director stated that she had a meeting with Dave Lambert, Donna Bohnenkamp, and Larry Wolf to discuss how the software has been working. At the time Springbrook software was purchased for the County, there was not a finished Highway Software in place. Springbrook's promise to the Counties who purchased the software was that they would eventually have one in place. This has not happened to date; so a conversion software system has been installed to alleviate the double entry that had to be done by the Highway Department. The system is working much better at this time. Chippewa County is currently working with Springbrook to finalize a workable software that will meet the needs for Wisconsin Highway Departments.

After discussion it was decided to wait to see what package is developed by Chippewa County and Springbrook. The conversion software is working very well for the Highway Department; it is not costing the county anything to wait until Springbrook can come up with a workable software. If the software works up to the expectation of the Highway Department; that will be the time Grant County will make the final decision to either purchase the package or go with an alternative plan.

<u>Meeting Times:</u> Larry Wolf, Chair stated that there had been some concern regarding the consistency of the starting times of all the County Board Committee Meetings and County Board Meeting. After discussion on the pros and cons stated by board members regarding this issue; Larry Wolf asked the Board how they would like to resolve this.

Robert Scallon, seconded by Dale Hood, made a motion to leave the starting times up to the discretion of each committee; that each committee will establish the starting time of future meetings during the committee meeting to be approved by the majority. Motion carried.

Orchard Manor, Robert Keeney—the new Director of Nurses started a week ago, November 13th the Farm will be opening bids for the timber cutting.

Law Enforcement, Robert Scallon—No meeting this month, Parks Meeting—No meeting this month.

River Rail Transit Commission—6000 ties will be replaced from Prairie du Chien to Madison; recycling old ties in Cassville.

Hidden Valley, Grant Loy—Tourism meeting in Livingston, WI on the 21st at the Firehouse, looking for input on tourism in Grant County.

River Rail Transit Commission, Gary Ranum—There will be more discussion on whether or not it is necessary that the Counties pay an annual fee. Things are going well for the Railway in their capital investments; fees may be unwarranted.
