<u>Amendment to Penalty Ordinance for Law Enforcement</u>: Nate Dreckman, Sheriff presented the Ordinance Amendment to the Board for their approval which will make the ordinance penalties easier to enforce.

ORDINANCE NO. 66

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE SECTIONS 206-17(c), 173-5 and 173-6(a) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF GRANT COUNTY, WISCONSIN, RELATING TO FORFEITURE AMOUNTS FOR CERTAIN OFFENSES.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF GRANT COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I: Section 206-17 C. is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

"C. Each violation of a provision of this chapter shall be subject to a forfeiture not to exceed \$500.00 plus statutory costs."

Section II: Section 173-5 and 173-6 A. are hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

"173-5 Violations and penalties.

Any person found to be in violation of this chapter shall forfeit the sum of not greater than \$1,000.00 plus statutory costs. If the violator is between the ages of 14 and 17, the forfeiture shall not exceed \$50.00 plus statutory costs. If the violator is less than 14 years of age, the forfeiture shall not exceed \$50.00.

173-6. Cash deposit.

A. The cash deposit which can be posted for a violation of § 173-1 of the chapter shall not exceed \$1,000.00 for a forfeiture plus statutory costs, including but not limited to the jail assessment, the penalty assessment, the crime laboratories and drug assessment, court costs, the court support service fees and the justice information fee."

Section III: This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication or posting as required by law.

The proposed changes would allow the use of certain property in Paris Township in Section 21 of 10 ac. as Agriculture A-2 for single family dwelling; Wingville Township in Section 4 of 2.95 ac. as Agriculture A-2 for single family dwelling. The proposed

ordinance incorporating any change in the plan, as well amendments to the comprehensive map as a result of said Ordinance are available for viewing at the Grant County Zoning office at 150 W. Alona Lane, Lancaster, WI.

Proposed changes were approved by the Townships and Planning and Zoning.

WHEREAS, a petition for map amendment was filed and a public hearing was held by the Grant County Zoning & Sanitation Committee, meeting the requirements of Chapter 59.69.

WHEREAS, a proof of publication and giving notice to Ellenboro Township Clerk of such hearing is attached to this document.

WHEREAS, the Zoning & Sanitation Committee now recommends to the Board of Supervisors of Grant County the adoption of this map amendment.

THEREFORE, the Grant County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows. That the Zoning District Map for the Township of Ellenboro will be amended to include the following described land as Agriculture A-2.

Robert Keeney asked if the county was within budget so far in the renovation and Roger Guthrie asked if there would be penalties if the debt was paid faster then expected. Larry Wolf stated that would be decided by the Board when those decisions were discussed.

Committee Reports:

Executive, John Beinborn— all issues were covered in the Board Meeting.

Economic--By the end of January Economic Development is hoping to have Dick's Bakery sold. January 22, 2014 Economic will hold their next meeting at the Elmo Club, Cuba City.

LLC, Mark Stead--Finalize cost sharing for the current year. Lynda Schweikert has conducted the second of four Planned Nutrient trainings; ten are enrolled in the class.

Ag and Extension/Fair, John Patcle—2014 Fair Convention is coming up, finalizing preparations for the 2014 County Fair.

Highway—no meeting was held to report.

Orchard Manor, Robert Keeney—No timber bids came in, Receptionist has resigned; the lease for Majestic Farms to rent the County Farm has been renewed for a five year contract.

Law Enforcement, Robert Scallon—Hired a new Sergeant from Platteville area, there was some water damage done to the jail by one of the inmates. There are a few prisoners out of the county again at this time.

Parks Meeting—No meeting this month.

River Rail Transit Commission—the contracts and governing laws are being rewritten with the new owners.

Hidden Valley, Grant Loy—Hidden Valley magazines have gone to print for 2014 the number of copies will be decreased do to expanding technology methods to distribute the books.

River Rail Transit Commission, Gary Ranum—To add to Robert Scallon's report; there has been some difficulty with the signals in Madison area railway crossings, there may have to be a monitoring system installed to make sure the signals are working properly.

Continuus, Gary Ranum—Continuus leadership was going to speak with DHS regarding the capitation fees. They were going to make a recommendation that they would operate this year on a 1.8 million dollar deficit budget and finance this using their reserves in hopes to help in their budget negotiations for next year to have these fees decreased for 2015.

ADRC, Dale Hood—Business as normal, had a 6 month evaluation on Lori Reid the new Director; Lori is doing fine.

Health, Dwight Nelson –discussed options to replace the WIC van. The Dental Hygienist will now contract with the schools and do their own billing for those services. There is an 11% reduction in Pre-mature births in Grant County. February 26th will be the next Health Committee meeting.

Social Services, Carol Beals—held Fred Naatz's evaluations and changed the January meeting date during the December meeting.

Veteran, Lester Jantzen—Korean War Book will be available to all Korean Vets through the Veterans Service office at no cost. Department of Veterans Affairs and DOT is offering to print Veteran on the drivers licenses, cost will be relevant if the Veteran chooses to have this added on his drivers license before the expirations date is due.

Zoning/Sanitation will be meeting on the 19th of December.

Public Property/IT, Vince Loeffelholz— approved a request to carryover the amount of \$3,100.00 from Public Property requests for 2013 to the 2014 requests for seal coating their parking lot.

<u>Public Comments</u>: Tim Murphy asked permission to submit a grant request, **see Grant requests**. Tim also clarified the cost of \$14.00 that would associate with Veterans wanting the word "Veteran" printed on their driver's license before their license was to expire.
